Leaf measures 13 1/8 x 8 3/8 inches. Bound in contemporary calf with arms of James I stamped in gold on centers of covers, red mottled edges. On inside front cover is a label reading: "The gift of a true Friend to Mr. Charles Palmer. May the 10th

1707. Unidentified armorial bookplate. Formerly in the Edmund Brooks collection. Number 524 in an unidentified auction sale.

A stub following folio e₂ is part of the original leaf e₃ which was apparently cut off and not printed when it was found that the material could be printed on three leaves, and the original e₄ is now the third leaf in this signature.

There is no supplement in this copy with the title, Paterne for a King's Inauguration, as is described in Lowndes and Brunet, and dated 1620.

This is dedicated to Prince Charles. The portrait of King James is by John Bill after Simon Passaeus, the engraved title-page is by Renold Elstracke and the portrait of Prince Charles is by Passeus.
