NOTE ON PRINCETON UNIVERSITY LIBRARY'S  
ADDITIONAL IRISH HOLDINGS

The preceding list indicates those authors gathered under the aegis of the Leonard L. Milberg Collection of Irish Prose Writers. Certain canonical figures in the history of Irish prose do not appear in this roll call simply because they have already been included in the lists of the two previous Milberg collections or because Princeton University Library already has extensive holdings of their works. The Department of Rare Books and Special Collections in Princeton's Firestone Library possesses rich deposits of the works of Laurence Sterne, Jonathan Swift, Oliver Goldsmith, James Stephens, James Joyce, Flann O'Brien, Anthony Cronin, and others. As described in Howard Woolmer's foreword, the Collection of Irish Prose Writers expands on the two previous Milberg collections of Irish literature, which contain further editions and ephemera by and related to the authors in this latest collection. Manuscripts and letters pertaining to all three Milberg collections are catalogued in the Leonard L. Milberg Autograph Collection. Correspondence with Beckett and Joyce can be found in the Sylvia Beach Papers. Additional early editions of works by Maria Edgeworth, Charles Maturin, Oscar Wilde, and other nineteenth-century authors can be found in the Robert H. Taylor Collection of English and American Literature. Typescripts and letters of many mid-twentieth-century writers are housed in the Archives of *Story* Magazine and Story Press.
